Then we got our baggage and meet Fr. Sudhir and Fr. Alan, who were waiting for us at the airport, and we were taken to St. Joseph Vocational Training Centre, which was very close to the airport. Finally, at 1 am in the morning we arrived to our rooms and could have some well-deserved rest.





















### 🧡 Khartoum, Sudan

#### Monday, August 30th

After a good (but short) night sleep, we woke up in the **Vocational Training Centre** and met everybody in the community. All Salesian brothers and the staff who work in the institution were very welcoming and made us feel at home.

First, after breakfast, we met the **administration office** and discussed the agenda for our whole journey. Then, **we were shown the premises and the facilities of the Vocational Centre**.



After a break time to work on our future meetings, we went to visit **Mr. Michele Rescaldani, UE Programme Manager for Resilience and Sustainable Development in Sudan.** He works on TVET development in the country and was really interested in SAAM and offered his support to help disseminate the project.























#### Tuesday, August 31st

It was a busy morning on Tuesday. We started the day visiting the facilities of GIZ (German Society for International Cooperation) and met **Dr. Martin Bütow**, advisor VET for the **GIZ Employment Initiative in Khartoum**, and his team. We shared information about our projects and had a fruitful exchange of ideas that could benefit both organizations.



Then, we visited two different Salesian schools in the outskirts of Khartoum (primary and secondary school) we were shown the facilities, met the staff and had a nice chat with the Salesian community living in the Parish.

We even made time to quickly visit the **National History Museum in Khartoum,** where we could admire the remains of some of the oldest Sudanese temples.

After having lunch back at the centre with congregation, we spent the rest of the day doing paperwork and preparing the following days to come.

#### Wednesday, September 1st

On Wednesday, we visited the facilities of **St. Joseph's Vocational School** and met all the teachers and staff who work in the educational centre. They showed us their different departments and classrooms and introduced us to their students.









We also had a meeting with all the teachers to talk about SAAM and shared ideas and impressions about the project. They were really interested in the programme and gave us some suggestions and ideas that could highly benefit SAAM and the next steps of the project. It was a great exchange of ideas, fears, and expectations that shows that SAAM can have a real impact and hopefully make a difference in all of us participants. We also talked to some of the teachers and students about their life and recorded some videos.



















### 🤉 Khartoum, Sudan

#### Thursday, September 2nd

We spent the day visiting the province of North Kordofan, in the South of Sudan, where we met the Salesian community who are in charge of the Don Bosco Technical School of El Obeid. It was a long road journey across the country but it was well worth it.



The Salesian community introduced us to the staff and students who spend their day to day in the school, showed us the different TVET departments and facilities and shared with us their plans for a future Secondary School in their centre. They shared their experiences working with child refugees from Darfur, their achievements in giving quality training to more than 150 students a year in areas such as General Mechanics, AutoMechanics, Plumbing, Carpentry or Electricity.

They even had time to introduce us to another public VET centre who works in the area and we were able to chat with teachers and students about their work, their life and their expectations.

After the visit, we went back to **Khartoum** in time for dinner, and luckily just before a huge rainstorm that fell over the city during the whole night.



We were expecting Sudan to be a very desert place, but we just happened to arrive during the rainy season.



















#### Friday, September 3rd

Today, being Friday in Sudan, was a holiday, so **there was no class**. In the morning, we received the visit of **the secretary of the Bishop of Khartoum** and spent the morning with him. He shared his view on SAAM and the possibility of international mobilities and his own experiences abroad. Then, we had the opportunity to meet the **nuncio of Khartoum**, **Msgr. Luis Miguel Muñoz Cardaba**. He welcomed us into his office and showed great interest in our project, giving his blessings to SAAM and offering his support if needed.



In the afternoon, we visited the homes of some of the teachers and staff who are part of St. Joseph's Vocational Training Centre. They introduced us to their families and their day-to-day life and made us feel like home. We couldn't be more grateful. We even had time to visit the banks of River Nile and relax walking along the longest river in the world!





















#### Saturday, September 4th

Saturday was a special day for us SAAMers, as the Salesian community in St. Joseph's Vocational Centre wanted to have a detail with us visitors and took us to see the **Pyramids of Meroe**.



It was a thrilling experience to visit some of the oldest pyramids in the world, discovering the **Sahara** desert and learning about life in Sudan **out of the cities**. We could see **traditional towns**, **lots of shepherds guiding their cattle and a desert like we couldn't have ever imagined**. It was a wonderful experience that we will always keep engraved in our minds!

During the afternoon we conducted some interviews and prepared our last day, with the meeting with Mr. Alfonso Herrero, Deputy Ambassador, in the Spanish Embassy and the visit of Mr. Michele Rescaldani, UE Programme Manager in Sudan, with whom we appointed another meeting to continue our last compelling discussion over TVET projects in Sudan.





















#### Sunday, September 5th


