### **Quick** recapitulation

The SAAM pilot project is concluding its 4 years of work. The SAAM Leaders event was held in Bilbao, hosted by the promoter San Viator. The event marked the end of the capacity building that began in Brussels with partners, culminating in a successful public conference to present the lessons learned.





















SAAM, the pilot project funded by the European Commission to test international mobility for Vocational Training between Africa and Europe, gathered the project partners and experts from more than thirty different countries in the city of Bilbao for the **SAAM Leaders** event **hosted by the promoter San Viator**. This meeting starts to mark the end of this project led by the San Viator (Sopuerta, Bilbao) and Mundus (Zaragoza) and which has already managed to exceed 400 mobilities.

The encounter began with a two-day partners meeting that meant the end of SAAM's capacity building initiated in the seminars in Brussels. On this occasion, programs such as Capacity building in the field of vocational education and training (VET) were explained in detail and several networking sessions were held to find common interests for future collaboration. The latest advances of the project were also presented: the intercultural preparation handbook, the SAAM Network - a tool promising to sustain collaboration between the two continents - and the current state of mobility.

To put the finishing touch to the SAAM Leaders meeting, a public conference was held. The project is about to conclude its four-year work and it was already a perfect opportunity to presented its **results, impact, and future vision** at a public conference held at the Euskalduna Palace in the Basque city on Thursday, November 9, 2023. The **Conference on the impact and future of educational mobility between Africa and Europe: Reflections from the SAAM pilot program** was a success!

### Why did we call this Seminar 'SAAM Leaders'?



SAAM is piloting for the first time a mobility scheme in the field of Vocational Education and Training (VET) connecting Africa and Europe. The term 'SAAM Leader' is chosen to represent the last step of the Capacity Building of the leaders who will continue the SAAM action after the project ends. This represents an unprecedented effort. To be a SAAM leader suggests a shared responsibility for individuals, regardless of their African or European background, to take on leadership roles in sustaining and continuing the SAAM legacy.

It encompasses the **culmination of experiences and knowledge gained**, serving as a call to action for all involved to contribute to the continuity of the SAAM legacy.

Hence, the aim of this **two-day seminar** (plus a public event) was to familiarize participants with the **tools** developed by SAAM, comprehend the **knowledge** and **capacity-building** accrued over years of project implementation, grasp the landscape SAAM has unveiled, and ultimately step up to **lead the continued SAAM** initiatives post-project completion.





### **SAAM Network**



### Conference on the impact and future of educational mobility between Africa and Europe



During the "Conference on the impact and future of educational mobility between Africa and Europe", experiences and lessons acquired through the SAAM pilot program were presented. The project promoter and host of the event (San Viator), the coordinating team (Mundus), several project partners, some of the students that are currently experiencing a SAAM mobility in Spain and representatives from Spanish and international educational institutions took the floor to share their experience with the project and what they hope for the future.

Afterwards we had the opportunity to hear first-person testimonies from SAAM partners, both **European teachers** who have traveled to Africa to discover the VET system of their peer countries and **African teachers** who have carried out their capacity building in the European centers. Furthermore, since the event coincided with the stay in the Basque Country of groups of students doing their SAAM mobility, we were able to hear the testimony of a student from **Kenya and another from Malawi.**

To end the event, we held a **networking brunch** to finish reflecting on what SAAM has achieved and the future of collaboration.











The Thursday event at **Euskalduna Palace** was a prime opportunity to, for the very first time, showcase alongside our partners the SAAM project and its current outcomes in the country of its origin and coordination, Spain.

This marked the inaugural presentation of SAAM from inception to completion, as recounted through the firsthand experiences of those living it. It served as a chance to connect with human stories, absorb valuable lessons and insights, and contemplate the future.

A future that SAAM is paving the way for, and it is the collective responsibility of us all to play a role in it.
